ALNS Year 9 History Trip to Ypres

From the 14th to the 16th of February, 41 Year 9 students went on an amazing history trip to Ypres, Belgium. We visited key sites from World War I, learning about the soldiers who fought and the impact

Day One: First Stops

After a very early start, we arrived in Belgium and began our journey through history. Our first visit was to Lijssenthoek Cemetery, the second-largest war cemetery in Belgium. We learned about Nellie Spindler, one of the few women buried there, who was a nurse during the war.

Next, we went to Essex Farm Cemetery, where the famous war poem In Flanders Fields was written. Seeing the grave of Valentine Joe Strudwick, a soldier who died at just 15, made us realise how young many of the soldiers were.

We also visited Yorkshire Trench, a real trench from World War I. Walking through it helped us imagine what life was like for soldiers in battle.

After a long but interesting day, we arrived at Hotel Pax, where we had dinner and some time to relax.

Day Two: Cemeteries and Remembrance The next day, we visited Tyne Cot Cemetery, the largest Commonwealth cemetery in the world. Seeing so many graves made us really understand the scale of the war.

At Hooge Crater Museum, we looked at weapons, uniforms, and a model trench. Then, we explored Hill 62 (Sanctuary Wood), where we walked through real battlefield trenches.

SERVICE CHILDREN PUPIL VOICE EVENT

On 23rd January 2025, a wet and blustery day, myself and 7 students attended the Gosport and Portsmouth Festival of Friends Service Children's Pupil Voice event at the University of Portsmouth, along with a large number of other schools.

After a wonderful welcome in one of the lecture theatres, we made our way to one of the classrooms and met Clive Sanders, a military poet and retired Army Officer. He told us how he became a poet and said that everyone can be a poet!

He showed us a beautiful poem he had written about Remembrance and encouraged everyone to write a few lines of what they thought about Remembrance and what it meant to them. As a Service Child myself, I found this all very interesting. The students then discussed some memories, and again wrote some lines. It was great listening to some of the memories, and took me back to some of my own!

After lunch we met for a sharing activity. Some of the other activities had been crafts and song-writing. Some students read their poems out at the front.

Our afternoon activity was as a team. We had a Dandelion drawing and everyone was encouraged to write something on the Dandelion about how it felt to be a Service Child and what we could do as a school to help and support them. Our Students talked about meeting up regularly and having access to mental health support at school.

COREY'S AMAZING DARTS JOURNEY SO FAR

Corey in Year IO, MR 8, first showed an interest in his Dad's steel tip dartboard at home at just 7 years old, so for his 8th birthday, he received a soft tip dartboard to practice safely. From then on he progressed to steel tip darts and soon joined the Portsmouth Darts Academy for under-18s.

Corey's ability has seen him rise to the third from top ranking in his Portsmouth Academy! While the recent success of Luke Littler has influenced children to take up darts, Corey was ahead of the game – He has been playing darts for nearly seven years now. Corey's ability has seen him join the local Portsmouth Darts League in Waterlooville where he plays alongside professionals such as Andy Jenkins and Simon Whitlock.

Corey finished as runner-up in his first regional under 17's tournament recently - This was a competition open to local youths UI7s from in and around Hampshire.

In February, he entered his first National Darts Competition at the JDC Foundation Tour, held in Coventry where he revealed his first very own custom-made darts shirt! He played some great darts and finished the match with 8 100+ scores, a 180, another decent 3DA and an average check out of 66.5.

Corey is currently the highest place youth player and Ilth out of 143 players from around Hampshire and Sussex – He recently achieved a personal best of 1066 in March. Such a score equates to a black shirt level, which prior to 2025 was the highest level possible! At the end of this darts season, he reached the Quarter Final and received his biggest payout yet of £150! Keep up the amazing work Corey! \bigcirc
