Mock Exams Results: In the recent mocks some of the common mistakes were:

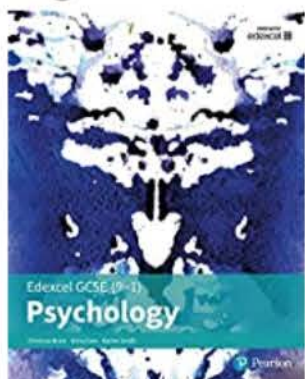
- ⇒ *Not **linking** the answer to the **scenario** or **research***
